NARRATOR 1, 2, 3 TIGER, MONKEY, RABBIT, CHEETAH, BOY, COW, ELEPHANT, JACKAL CHORUS

ALL: Good afternoon! We are Class 401. The story we are going to read is an Indian folktale, The Tiger and the Jackal. Hope you'll like it.

NARRATOR 1: Once upon a time, there was a tiger who was caught in a trap.

TIGER: Growl! Growl! Let me out! Let me out! GROWL!

NARRATOR 2: The rabbit hopped away immediately without looking back.

TIGER: Wait! Growl! Growl!

NARRATOR 3: Before long, a cheetah came by searching for the rabbit.

CHEETAH: Oh Rabbit, where are you?

TIGER: Cheetah!

CHEETAH: Who's there?

TIGER: It's me, Tiger! I am stuck in this cage. Please let me out! CHEETAH: Huh! Who cares? I have a rabbit to chase! Oh,

there it is! Come on, Rabbit!

NARRATOR 1: The cheetah ran after the rabbit and soon was gone.

NARRATOR 2: The tiger was sad because no one helped her.

NARRATOR 3: The tiger waited and waited hoping someone passed by.

NARRATOR 1: Then, a boy came running along the road.

BOY: Hop! Skip! Jump!

TIGER: Boy! Help me, please! Free me from this cage!

BOY: That's not fair! You promised!

TIGER: Ho, ho! But I'm a tiger and tigers don't keep promises! GROWL!

CHORUS: (Song)

I am behind you, I'll always find you, I am the tiger
People who fear me never go near me, I am the tiger
And if I meet you, what if I eat you, I am the tiger
I am behind you, I'll always find you, I am the tiger
Tiger, tiger!

NARRATOR 1: The tiger opened her mouth wide, wide, WIDE! CHORUS: That's not fair! That's not fair! She promised!

COW: Moo! Moo! Moo!

NARRATOR 2: Just then, a cow came trudging down the road.

COW: Oh no! A tiger is having her dinner. I'd better keep going.

BOY: Gracious Cow! Please listen to me!

COW: I... I don't have time now.

BOY: Please! I let the tiger out of the trap, and now she wants to eat me for her dinner. She promised that she wouldn't. So, it's not fair, is it?

COW: I... I don't think it's... not fair. Sorry.

NARRATOR 3: The cow said no more and trudged on.

TIGER: See? Ha! Ha! And now I must eat you for my dinner! GROWL!

CHORUS: No! No! Don't eat the boy!

Help! Help! Someone help him!

ELEPHANT: Thump! Thump! Thump!

NARRATOR 1: Down the road trundled an elephant.

ELEPHANT: Uh-oh! The tiger is having her dinner. I'd better go away. Or, I may get into trouble.

BOY: Noble Elephant! I freed the tiger from the cage. Now she wants to eat me for her dinner. It's not fair, is it?

ELEPHANT: (Clear his throat) Fair, or not fair, that is the question! I don't see... it's not fair.

NARRATOR 2: The elephant said no more and trundled on. TIGER: See? HA! HA! HA! I must eat you now! GROWL!

CHORUS: No! No! Don't eat the boy!

Help! Help! Someone help him!

JACKAL: Pitter patter! Pitter patter! Pitter patter! **NARRATOR 3:** Down the road pattered a jackal.

JACKAL: Oh no! The boy is in danger!

BOY: Jackal! I let the tiger out of the trap. Now she wants to eat me. She promised that she wouldn't. So, it's not fair, is it?

JACKAL: What? What did you let the tiger out of?

BOY: A trap.

BOY: A trap!
